A Letter from Pastor April

We are reminded in Ecclesiastes that there are seasons in life –a time to plant, and a time to harvest. Throughout all the seasons of life God is faithful.

It is with sadness and gratitude that I submit my resignation to you, my last Sunday in the pulpit will be Sunday, December 29, 2024. I am not leaving to serve another church, but to serve as the Director for the Center for Proclamation at the Omaha Presbyterian Seminary Foundation. On my last Sunday in the pulpit, December

29th, there will be a congregational meeting to dissolve my call, effective January 31, 2025. While I will be in the office December 30 and 31st, my four weeks of unused vacation will put my last effective day as January 31, 2025.

My twenty years in parish ministry have been extraordinarily fulfilling, but it has been two decades and I'm ready for what's next, a new adventure. After much prayer and conversation with trusted friends and colleagues, I have discerned that God is calling me to a different kind of ministry. I wasn't actively searching for a new position, rather this one found me and timing didn't align, and then it found me again.

I expect the month ahead to be an emotional one. We have forged strong bonds together as the body of Christ, and leaving is hard. Please know that I am available to you in the next month. I would welcome the chance to have coffee, a meal, or visit and say goodbye.

I will continue to pray for you even as I leave you and I hope you will pray for me and my family as we say goodbye. The good news of the Gospel is that God is making all things new, and I know God has been and will continue to be faithful at Trinity as you enter this new season. I trust that as God calls me away from Trinity, God is already preparing the next pastor who will walk with you.

Thank you for an abundant seven years of ministry.

We are in the midst of a Generosity Campaign for planning the 2025 budget. We are also requesting that each member complete the survey of talents. Both are requested to be returned to the church by Generosity Sunday, November 10th! Additional copies of each form are available in the church office. Please respond as soon as possible to reduce the amount of follow-up mailings and phone calls.

By now, you have, hopefully, read a letter mailed to you from Pastor April that she will be leaving us at the end of the year. Undoubtedly, this will present challenges to us. We are hoping to have a visit from Presbytery representatives after the worship service on Sunday, December 8. They will be able to explain the process that a Presbytery representative will lead us through and answer questions that each of us may be thinking about. Please plan to attend this informational session. We will also hold a congregational meeting after worship on December 29 to officially dissolve the relationship between Pastor April and our congregation. At this time, we are expecting a significant deficit budget for 2025. While we have added a few new members this year, we have lost or are about to lose a number of significant donors. The Session has formed a temporary Work Group to address this situation and develop some possible solutions. Expect to hear from the Work Group and probably have another informational gathering of the congregation to hear your input. A date has not yet been determined for this.

As always, the Session appreciates each of our members and friends and encourages feedback on the mission and ministry of Trinity Presbyterian Church. Please keep our congregation in your prayers as we are encountering some significant challenges as we enter the new year.

Blue Christmas/Longest Night Worship With Those Who Mourn

Blue? Yes, blue as in the blues. As in "I am feeling blue." Not everyone is up and cheery for the Christmas holidays. Dealing with the death of a loved one, facing life after divorce or separation, coping with the loss of a job, living with cancer or some other dis-ease that puts a question mark over the future, and a number of other human situations make parties and joviality painful for many people

in our congregations and communities. There is a growing attentiveness to the needs of people who are blue at Christmas. Increasing numbers of churches are creating sacred space for people living through dark times. Such services are reflective, accepting where we really are, and holding out healing and hope.

Some churches hold a service of worship on the longest night of the year, which falls on or about December 21st, the Winter Solstice. There is an interesting convergence for this day as it is also the traditional feast day for Saint Thomas the Apostle. This linkage invites making some connections between Thomas's struggle to believe the tale of Jesus' resurrection, the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss.



Winter Safety Reminder: Snow & Ice Preparedness

Select proper footwear. Shoes or boots that have rubber or neoprene composite soles have better traction on ice than leather or plastic. There are also many slip on style ice grippers and cleat-style winter footwear accessories available in stores.

first, then grab items you need from inside. Hold on to your vehicle for support.

Take short, shuffling steps. This makes it easier for your body to right itself before slipping.

Take your time. Assess your path. You may not see "black ice" until it is too late, causing you to seriously injure yourself. Assess your travel path by sliding your shoe or boot over it to see if it is slick.

Snow, ice and cold are just part of the yearly routine. If you would like to pull up to Trinity's curb for drop offs, please do so. Again, use caution and alert the office if you plan to visit the church if you need assistance.

New children's worship bags are available at Trinity. They are filled with quiet activities like coloring pages, small puzzles, Bible story booklets, and more!" The bags are designed to provide quiet activities for children to do during church services, particularly during sermons, to help them focus and stay engaged. Contents in each bag will vary but typically will contain a combination of the following items:

- Coloring books and crayons
- Bible story activity pages
- Small puzzles or mazes
- Stickers
- Playdough
- Sensory items like textured fabrics or beads
- Small toys or manipulatives

Worship Bag Benefits:

- Keeps kids occupied and less disruptive during worship
- Provides a sense of purpose and engagement during the sermon
- Can be themed to match the current Bible lesson
